We started this ministry at St. Philip 10 years ago in hopes to share God's unconditional love in and throughout our wider community. As much as we personally have tried to share love unconditionally, we keep failing as our all too human traits interfere. We love being able to share the unconditional love our animals are capable of showing us as we are out and about visiting with them in various settings.

At St Philip we have evaluated over 170 handlers with their companion animals: dogs, horses, cats, and bunnies. It has taken over 1,200 volunteer hours to support these evaluation processes. Although we are not able to assess just how far reaching our ministry truly is, we can share these impacts with you:

- Out of our evaluation events 109 teams were able to become registered Pet Therapy Teams
- Teams engage with people in hospice settings, Hospital visitations in pediatrics, neurotrauma, palliative care, ICU; Animal assisted therapy with patients undergoing physical therapy; reading programs in school; special needs children support; crisis events, Hospice settings, Nursing and Retirement homes, University campuses, etc.
- We estimate that the Pet Therapy teams who completed their registrations with us translate into thousands of impactful interactions EVERY year in our community.
- Impactful visits have sped up recovery time, brought countless smiles in dire situations, peace to the dying, sharing of furry hugs, and have created bridges for human connection.

We have been so blessed to be witnesses of Christ's love working in our community. Let's keep going!! Pawsitively Excited, Sybille and Mark Nelson

What's Next at St. Philip?

St. Philip is called to Live Like That: Love, Feed, Serve. It's not a matter of if we will, but how will we. As we begin to think about our shared ministry particularly as our staff at St. Philip changes and evolves, many of you may be asking What's next at St. Philip? Your St. Philip church council is asking that very question amongst a host of other questions. A natural inclination would be to hurriedly come up with some answers, but our council is purposeful in carefully and mindfully approaching who God is calling us to be, including lots of prayers and a true openness to God's Spirit moving. Rest assured what informs all of it is our desire to live like Christ to love and feed and serve. It's not a matter of if we will, but how we will.

The congregation is invited to participate fully in this discernment process. If you have thoughts, comments, dreams, or aspirations do not hesitate to speak to any of our council members or Pastor David.

What is the Minnick Center? And What is St. Philip's Ministry there?

The Minnick Center is a place for students who are experiencing challenges connecting well with the public school system. For most of them they just need a little extra help. The center serves students in Kindergarten through 10th grade and the goal is to get students back to their home school in the public system better able to learn in that environment. One of the gaps in the experience at the Minnick Center is there are few opportunities for additional activities outside of the basic curriculum. AND this is where St. Philip is trying to fill the gap.

Over the past two years, a group from St. Philip has been providing "Art Class" and will continue that ministry this fall.
