What's Next at St. Philip?

Your St. Philip church council is asking that very question amongst a host of other questions. At our congregational meeting on December 15, St. Philip approved a Spending Plan/Budget for 2025. Some things of note:

- Spending plan is expected to match offerings in 2025
- Significant increase in property and maintenance line item to provide resources for a re-formed property team tasked with managing all things connected to our facility
- Significant decrease in staffing line item as our staff moves to one called pastor
- Significant decrease in utilities line item as our electricity is produced via solar energy

A number of you have asked what plans might be for our staff at St. Philip including if there is any plans for an additional pastor. At this time, the St. Philip council has decided to continue our ministry with the staff we currently have in place. If you have thoughts, comments, dreams, or aspirations do not hesitate to speak to any of our council members or Pastor David.



There were no unexpected expenses this month.




Solar Powered
